MANCHESTER POSTS 12 POINT WIN OVER FRANKLIN

The women's basketball team picked up their second straight conference win on the week as Manchester defeated host Franklin College 70-58. Manchester jumped to a 41-31 lead at the half with Heather Terflinger scoring 11 of her 16 points in the first half. Manchester outscored the Grizzlies 29-27 in the second half in route to the 70-58 win.

Terflinger added six rebounds and five steals with a pair of assists. Kelley Meiklejohn added 15 points and six rebounds on 6-10 shooting from the floor. Sarah Bose added 11 points and seven rebounds and five steals.

The women's team snapped a four game losing streak on Wednesday following MC's 77-36 win over Hanover in conference action. Manchester took a 47-17 lead at the half, shooting 57% from the floor on 20-35 shooting, hitting 5-11 three-pointers. Manchester outscored the Panthers 32-19 in the second half, forcing Hanover to 22 total turnovers while limiting themselves to just eight in the game.

Meiklejohn scored a game high 16 points, hitting 8-11 shots from the floor. Jessica Henn added 13 points on 5-7 shooting, adding four rebounds and a pair of steals. Lauren Kalis added 12 points on 5-9 shooting.

Manchester moves to 8-6 on the year, 4-1 in the conference. They return to action Wednesday as they travel to Bluffton.

FRANKLIN EDGES MC 62-59

Manchester's men's basketball team fell to visiting Franklin College 62-59 in league action Saturday afternoon. Manchester held a 27-26 lead at the half, but Franklin jumped out to a 19-4 run to start the second half. Manchester cut the lead down to a 59-57 Grizzlie lead with a minute remaining, but couldn't overtake the Franklin.

Jamaal Wade led Manchester with a 17 point performance. He added five rebounds, four assists and two steals. James Reed and Jeff Grabowski each had 12 points for MC, while Wes Gardner added 10 points and six rebounds.

The men's team fell to host Hanover College 74-66 in HCAC action Wednesday night. The win by Hanover is the 11th straight over MC, dating back to the 2001 season. Hanover held a three point lead over MC at the half, up 29-26 despite Manchester shooting 52% from the floor and holding the Panthers to 35%. Hanover's defense forced 23 MC turnovers in the game, compared to their 11 in the eight point win.

Jeff Grabowski and James Reed scored 16 points each for Manchester. Grabowski was 8-10 from the floor and added five rebounds, while Reed hit 4-7 three point attempts. Jamaal Wade added 12 points and seven rebounds, with three assists and a steal. Wes Gardner was held to seven points, but added eight rebounds for Manchester.

Manchester drops to 9-5 on the year, 1-4 in the conference. They host Bluffton on Wednesday, with the game carried live on 89.5 FM, WBKE.

VALLEJO PLACES THIRD AT MIDWEST CLASSIC

Manchester College's wrestling team returned to action after a 21-day break to place 15th overall at the Midwest Classic, hosted by the University of Indianapolis. Manchester was the top-place finishing Division III school out of the 24 schools participating.

Manchester sophomore Eracleo Vallejo placed third for Manchester at 125 pounds, advancing to the semi-finals on Friday, and falling in his first match of the day Saturday. He ended the tournament with a 5-1 record, and was the top place winner for any Division III competitor.

Manchester returns to action on Saturday, January 20, as MC hosts the 10th annual Spartan Mat Classic.
