MC FALLS TO OLIVET 33-14

Manchester went into the half down 17-0 to Olivet on Thursday, bounced back to start the third quarter to cut the Comet lead to 17-14, but allowed three OC touchdowns to give the Comets a 33-14 victory.

Manchester scored at the 10:59 mark of the second period as Joel Jawkins found Brandon Kidd open on a 19-yard touchdown reception. That score was set up by a Brent Ash 27 yard run that put the ball at the 50-yard line, then Hawkins found Jovan Joyner for a 37-yard strike to the Olivet nine yard line. A holding penalty brought the back ten yards to set up the Kidd TD reception.

Manchester held Olivet to a three-and-out series and drove 63-yards to set up a Joyner 14-yard touchdown run. Jared Yoder had receptions of 16 and 23 yards to help MC get into scoring position.

Hawkins ended the game 13-25 with two interceptions and 166 yards passing with a TD. Brent Ash had seven carries for 39 yards, and led MC with five receptions for 30 yards. Joyner had two catches for 56 yards total.

Defensively, Zack Smith had nine tackles to lead MC. Jared Markham, Josh Alvies, Ed Perry, Chuck Knott, Beau Bradtmiller and Mike DePoy each had four tackles. Manchester falls to 1-2 on the year. They resume action Sept. 30 for homecoming weekend as they host Defiance.

SPARTANS FINISHES 2-1 AT MC INVITE

Manchester posted a 2-1 record and a second place finish over the weekend at the 2006 Manchester College/Pizza Hut Volleyball Invitational. Manchester opened with a 3-0 win over Calumet College of St. Joseph (30-15, 30-26, 30-28). Stephanie Rion and Amy Carnahan had eight kills while Lindsey Bradtmueller picked up seven. Tiffany Moore had 27 assists and 12 digs.

The Spartans posted a 3-0 win over Robert Morris on Saturday (30-19, 30-22, 30-25). Rion and Carnahan led the way with ten and nine kills, respectively. Moore had three aces to go with her 28 assists and eight digs. Manchester closed out the tournament with a 3-0 loss to Huntington (30-25, 30-19, 30-22). Rion and Carnahan had eight kills apiece, Moore ended with 26 assists and eight digs and three aces. Jane Korzen had 25 digs in the contest.

All Tournament honors went to Tiffany Moore and Amy Carnahan of Manchester, Brittney Smelser, Renee Biberstine and Alyssa Schroeder of Huntington, and Megan Yerkes of Robert Morris. Manchester moves to 5-7 on the year and returns to action Tuesday at Anderson for an HCAC contest.

SPARTANS REMAIN UNDEFEATED IN CONFERENCE PLAY

The MC women's tennis team posted an 8-1 win over Defiance and a 7-2 win over Hanover Saturday to improve to a 7-1 record, 6-0 in HCAC play. Defiance took the one doubles flight, but MC swept the singles along with two and three doubles to pick up the win. Against Hanover, the Panthers took one and two singles matches from Mili Ridoutt and Sarah Conwell for their two flight wins of the match. Manchester, winners of 35 straight conference matches, returns to action Saturday at Bluffton.

MC GETS FIRST CONFERENCE WIN OF SEASON

The men's soccer team posted a 3-0 win over Franklin on Saturday to pick up their first conference win of the year. Parker Swanson scored the first two goals of the game for MC in the first half, striking on a Tyler Yeager assist five minutes into the game. Swanson then found the goal on a Chris Rowe assist at the 13th minute to go up 2-0. Aaron Cripe scored the third goal of the half at the 25th minute on a Brian Woods-Tyler Yeager double assist. Dante Samuels had two saves for MC, who out-shot the Grizzlies 10-2.

On Tuesday MC posted a 4-0 win at Huntington. Chris Rowe scored his first goal of the season in the first two minutes of play for the game winner on an Aaron Cripe assist. Jason Scheuer scored on a Brian Woods assist to give MC a 2-0 lead at the half, then Woods scored his second goal of the year in the 60th minute of play on a direct kick. Elie Francois scored for the second straight game in the 64th minute following a pass from Parker Swanson to give Manchester the 4-0 win. Kyle Ogden had five saves for MC in 80 minutes and Dante Samuel added one save for MC in the win.

Manchester improves to 4-1 on the year, 1-0 in the HCAC. They will travel to Goshen Tuesday for an 8 p.m. contest.

SPARTANS BLANK GRIZZLIES 9-0

Manchester College opened up HCAC play on Saturday with a 9-0 home victory over Franklin College. Stacey Jerke scored four goals and assisted on a fifth as Manchester took a 4-0 lead in the half. Also scoring for MC were Alicia Krueckeberg, Jaci Simmons, and Sara Kolenda, with assists coming from Katie Davis, Erin McComas, Miranda Ford and Kelly Picard.

Manchester College picked its third win of the season Wednesday in a 2-1 win over St. Mary's College. St. Mary's went up 1-0 in the 43rd minute of play to take the one goal lead into the half. Seven minutes into the second period Alicia Krueckeberg scored off a Stacey Jerke rebounded shot to tie the game up. Allison Moore scored the game winner in the 73rd minute off an Erin McComas assist to give Manchester the 2-1 win. Julie Eslinger had five saves for MC.

Manchester moves to 4-2 on the year, 1-0 in the HCAC. They host Tri-State on Wednesday and Captial on Saturday.

MEN AND WOMEN 19th AT INDIANA INTERCOLLEGIATE MEET

Manchester's women's cross country team traveled to Indiana State University Friday for the Indiana Intercollegiate meet, where both the men and women teams placed 19th overall.

On the men's side, Andy Williams was 78th overall in 27:57, followed by Ryan Speiss' 91st place in 28:21, Josh Miller was 93rd in 28:22, Josh Nifong in 114th place in 28:52 and Scott Staulbaum in 139th place in 29:46.

For the women, Becca Flanders led MC with a 55th place performance in 20:10. Other Spartan place winners included Breana Lindsay in 101st place in 21:08, Tiffany Alva, 119th place in 21:37, Ashton Gipson 121st in 21:48 and Kelsey Morris in 143rd place in 22:28. Manchester travels to Bluffton on Friday for the Bluffton Invite.
