FRANKLIN DEFEATS MANCHESTER 31-15

Manchester fell to Franklin 31-15 in football action on Saturday as part of Hall of Fame Day for Spartan athletics. Franklin scored early in the first quarter but Manchester responded with two seconds remaining following a Joel Hawkins five-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7 following the Kevin Phelps PAT attempt. Franklin scored twice in the second period, once on a 21-yard touchdown run and a 28 yard field goal attempt.

Hawkins found Jared Yoder for an 11-yard pass in the endzone as Manchester closed the scoring margin 16-13 with 9:26 remaining in the third. Franklin scored twice in the fourth to go ahead 31-13, but the Spartans picked up a safety following Jordan Cork's blocked punt in the back of the endzone. Hawkins ended the game with 121 yards rushing on 20 carries and a TD. He threw for 102 yards and a touchdown, connecting on 13 of 29 passes with four interceptions.

Zack Smith ended the game with nine tackles, while Mike DePoy added eight and Beau Bradtmiller had seven. Manchester falls to 1-8 on the year, 0-5 in the HCAC. They host Rose-Hulman starting at 1 p.m. on Saturday.

SPARTANS FALL TO TRANSYLVANIA, ADVANCE TO HCAC TOURNAMENT

Manchester's women's soccer team fell to Transylvania 1-0 in action Saturday afternoon. Transy scored in the 8th minute of play to pick up the win. Bri Sawa had five saves in the loss.

Manchester's women's soccer team picked up a 4-0 win over Defiance on Tuesday. Paige Koomler scored her first of third goals in the game in the third minute of play. She gave MC a 2-0 lead in the 40th minute of play on a penalty kick. Stacey Jerke scored the Spartans third goal of the game in the 47th minute of play off a Miranda Ford assist to give Manchester a 3-0 lead. Koomler scored her third goal of the game and 13th of the season at the 53rd minute to give Manchester the 4-0 win.

Manchester will travel back to Transylvania on Tuesday for the HCAC Tournament semi-finals starting at 4 p.m.

KNOY, HUPFER HEADLINE ALUM TO PLAY IN ALUMNI SCRIMMAGE

Manchester College men's head basketball coach Brad Nadborne and the men's basketball team will play host to several of the Spartan men's basketball alumni during a scrimmage in preparation for the 2006-07 season. TRANSY ENDS MC'S SEASON

The Manchester men's soccer team fell to Transylvania 4-0 in the final game of the regular season on Saturday. The loss knocked Manchester out of the HCAC Tournament pairings.

The men posted a 2-2 tie with Defiance following two overtime sessions on Wednesday. Manchester scored early in the game as Heriju Gadzama scored on an unassisted goal at the 11:30 mark of the first half. Defiance tied the game up at the 42nd minute off a Bradley Cannon goal to give a 1-1 tie at the break. The Yellow Jackets scored nine minutes into the second period as Brandon Hughes scored to give DC a 2-1 lead. Manchester's Brian Woods headed a pass from Carlos Marcet to tie the game up at 2-2 with six seconds remaining to force the overtime sessions. and ends their season with a 9-7-1 record overall, 3-4-1 in the HCAC.

**MEN THIRD, WOMEN FIFTH AT HCAC**

Manchester College placed third in the men's race and fifth in the women's at the 2006 HCAC Conference Championships hosted by Franklin College on Saturday. Manchester's Andy Williams and Josh Nifong were named to the All-Conference team for their Top 12 place finishes. Williams was 11th overall with a time of 27:56 and Nifong was one second behind to place 12th. Becca Flanders paced the women's team with a fifth place finish, running the 5K course in 24:35. Breana Lindsay was 14th with a time of 25:14. Anderson captured conference championships in both the men's and women's events.

The Spartans return to action Saturday, November 11th at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional, hosted by Hanover.

SPARTANS DROP THREE AT HUNTINGTON TOURNAMENT

Manchester College ended the Huntington Tournament with an 0-3 record from action on Friday and Saturday. On Friday MC fell to Michigan-Dearborn 3-0 (30-23, 30-26, 30-27). Amy Carnahan and Stephanie Rion had six kills each while Tiffany Moore added 20 assists and 14 digs. Saturday's action had the Spartans falling to Huntington 3-0 (30-26, 30-14) and to Anderson 3-0 (30-16, 30-16, 30-14). Against Huntington Tasia Smith had nine kills and three block assists and had a team high six blocks in the Anderson game.

Manchester drops to 10-17 on the year. They close out the regular season Wednesday at home versus Goshen then head off to the HCAC Tournament on Saturday and Sunday.
