MC DEFEATS MUSKINGUM 63-61

The women's basketball team posted a 63-61 victory over visiting Muskingum on Sunday as Heather Terflinger connected on two free throws with under a second remaining in the game to give Manchester the two point win. The Spartans trailed 35-27 at the half, but Sarah Conwell hit 6-7 shots from the floor in the second half, scoring all 14 of her points in the second period. The Spartans outscored Muskingum 36-26 in the second half and forced 11 turnovers while committing just three to pick up the 63-61 win.

Stacey Wendel ended the game with 15 points on 7-11 shooting from the floor. Conwell added 14 points on 6-9 shooting, and Sarah Bose added 12 points, six rebounds three assists and three steals. Terflinger added nine points and six rebounds for MC.

Manchester posted its second win of the year Tuesday night following a 56-53 win over St. Mary's (Ind.). The Spartans outscored the Belles 36-30 at the first half, but in the second it was Manchester's 8-10 free throw shooting that helped them hang on to the 56-53 lead, despite shooting just 5-22 in the second half from the field. MC was led by Kelley Meiklejohn's 11 points and six rebounds. She was 3-8 from the field and 4-4 from the free throw line. Brittany Rager added nine points on 4-7 shooting. She added four rebounds for the Spartans. Heather Terflinger and Lauren Kalis added eight points each, while Erica Hedges and Jessica Henn had six rebounds.

The women improve to 3-1 on the year, and host Defiance College on Wednesday to start HCAC play. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:30 p.m., with WBKE radio bringing you all the action.

MEN'S BASKETBALL POSTS A 72-56 WIN OVER EARLHAM

Manchester College's men's basketball team is off to its best start since the 1998-99 season at 4-0 following a 72-56 win over Earlham on Sunday. Manchester's Wes Gardner scored 21 points, hitting 6-10 shots from the floor and 4-7 from behind the arc to lead Manchester. He added six rebounds and two steals in the win. Kyle Plumlee added 15 points on 5-7 shooting, hitting three of four three pointers, while Jamaal Wade scored 11 points and added seven rebounds for Manchester. The Spartans held a 33-25 advantage at the half, shooting 52% from the floor on 12-23 shooting. The outscored Earlham 39-31 in the second half to pick up the 16 point win.

The men's team posted a 67-62 win over Tri-State, handing TSU their first loss of the season. Manchester opened up with a 29-27 lead at the half thanks in part to balanced scoring by nine different Spartans. Wes Gardner scored 12 of his 17 points in the second half and teammate Kyle Plumlee chipped in 10 of his 13 total points in the second as Manchester held on to the 67-62 win.

Gardner ended the game with 17 points, six rebounds and a steal, and hit 6-6 free throw attempts. Plumlee was 4-8 from the field with four rebounds and a pair of steals. Derek Hammond added eight points and four assists.

Manchester starts conference action on Wednesday as they travel to Defiance starting at 7:30 p.m.
