MANCHESTER FALLS IN DOUBLE OVERTIME TO TRANSYLVANIA

Manchester College fell to visiting Transylvania 86-74 after two overtime sessions in HCAC action Saturday afternoon. Manchester and Transy went into the half tied at 33-33, and the Spartans held a seven point lead with under three minutes remaining in the second half before Transy's Nick Feagan hit five of six free throws down the stretch to tie the game at 62-62, forcing overtime. Both teams scored seven points in the first overtime session, where the Pioneers outscored MC 17-5 in the second overtime period to pick up the 86-74 victory. Wes Gardner scored a team high 20 points for Manchester, adding nine rebounds on the afternoon. Jamaal Wade scored 12 points, adding five assists. Manchester falls to 6-2 on the year, 1-2 in the HCAC.

The Manchester College men's basketball team posted a 70-63 win at Kalamazoo on Tuesday evening. Manchester hit seven of eight free throws in the final two minutes of play to stall the Hornet's late surge. Manchester is currently shooting 82% from the free throw line this season.

Wes Gardner scored a game high 23 points, hitting 5-12 shots from the field, 5-11 from behind the arc and 8-9 free throws. He added eight rebounds, three assists and a steal. Jamaal Wade added 13 points, four rebounds and five assists, while James Reed hit all three of this three point attempts for nine points on the evening.

They return to action Saturday, as they host Taylor-Fort Wayne starting at 1 p.m.

MC FALLS TO TRANSYLVANIA

Manchester's women's basketball team suffered its first conference loss of the year Saturday following the 65-55 defeat to Transylvania. Transylvania took a 33-26 lead into the half, and outscored Manchester 32-29 in the second half as the Spartans shot 33% from the floor. Kelley Meiklejohn and Heather Terflinger scored 13 points each for Manchester. Meiklejohn added nine rebounds for MC, hitting 5-9 shots. Terflinger was 6-9 from the floor with three rebounds and a pair of steals.

Manchester's women's basketball team picked up a 69-63 win over Mount St. Joseph on Saturday to improve to 5-1 overall, 2-0 in the HCAC. The six point victory is the biggest winning margin posted by the Spartans so far this season. Manchester got off to a good start in the first half, leading the Mount 41-27 at the break. Manchester connect on 14-29 shots from the floor including 4-7 three pointers to take the 14 point lead at the half. Manchester's Stacey Wendel celebrated her 20th birthday with a 21 point performance to lead all scorers. The sophomore was 6-11 from the floor and 7-11 from the free throw line. She added four rebounds, two assists and two steals. Kelley Meiklejohn added 15 points and nine rebounds while Heather Terflinger added eight points and six rebounds.

Manchester falls to 5-2 on the year, 2-1 in the HCAC. They resume action Saturday at home as they finish off a doubleheader with the men, hosting Tri-State at 3 p.m.

MANCHESTER PLACES 10TH AT ONU INVITE

The Manchester College wrestling team placed 10th out of 21 teams at the Ohio Northern Invitational. The Spartans took home three place winners, including Eracleo Vallejo's third place finish at 125 pounds, Ben Hoover's fourth place finish at 174 and Joe Hoover's fifth place finish at 165. Manchester returns to Ohio Northern this Saturday for a dual meet starting at noon.
