SWANSON'S GOALLIFTS MC OVER HANOVER 2-1 IN OVERTIME

Manchester's men's soccer team picked up their fifth win in six games Saturday as they picked up a 2-1 overtime win over Hanover College. Manchester's Tyler Yeager scored 40 seconds into the second half to give MC a 1-0 lead, but the Panthers responded in the 77th minute of play to tie the game at 1-1, forcing the overtime session. Parker Swanson's goal in the fourth minute of overtime on a Brian Huss assist gave Manchester the 2-1 win. Jake Johnson had two saves for Manchester.

The men posted a 4-0 home victory over Bluffton on Tuesday. Pepo Villalba scored the game winner in the ninth minute of action to give Manchester the quick 1-0 lead. In the second half, the Spartan offense collected three goals, coming from Chris Rowe, Villalba assisted by Tom Garrett and Parker Swanson. Jake Johnson recorded five saves in the win. Manchester improves to 10-3-1 on the year, 3-1-1 in the HCAC. They host Anderson on Wednesday and travel to Elmhurst on Saturday.

MANCHESTER SHAVES 29 STROKES FROM DAY ONE'S SCORE TO PLACE FOURTH AT HCAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Manchester's women's golf team fired a 392 in Sunday's round two of the HCAC Conference Tournament to finish fourth overall. Saturday's team score of 421 had the Spartans 10 strokes behind Anderson for fourth place, and just one stroke ahead of Hanover, who was in sixth place overall.

Stacey Goins placed eighth for Manchester, giving her All-Conference honors for MC. Goins fired a 94 on Saturday and a 91 on Sunday for an overall 185 score. Erica Hahn tied for 10th place with a 104-86/190, Mary McCauley shot a 108-104/212, and Jessica Kantzer shot a 115-111/226 to round out the Spartans top four.

MOORE'S GOAL HELPS MC TO A 3-3 TIE WITH HANOVER

Manchester's women's soccer team posted a 3-3 tie following two overtime sessions on Saturday. Manchester scored early in the first half as Sarah Kolenda connected on a deflected ball to give MC a 1-0 lead in the 24th minute. Hanover's Felicia Adams scored twice to give Hanover a 2-1 halftime lead, but MC responded with a pair of goals in the second half, the first from Erin McComas in the 76th minute and Allison Moore picked up the tying goal in the 82nd minute of play. Samantha Wade recorded four saves for MC.

Manchester posted its second conference win of the season on Wednesday in a 6-0 victory over Bluffton. Sophomore Paige Koomler scored the first four goals of the game, including three in the first half on assists from Erin McComas and Laura Nietert to give MC the 3-0 halftime lead. Koomler struck again early in the second half, while Katie Davis and Kali Lauzon scored late in the second period. McComas assisted the second and teamed up with Allison Moore on the double assist for her third assist of the afternoon. They move to 4-8-3 on the year, 2-2-1 in the conference and host Anderson on Wednesday.

MANCHESTER COMES AWAY WITH FIVE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS OUT OF NINE AT THE HCAC INDIVIDUAL FLIGHT TOURNAMENT

Manchester College's women's tennis team captured five of the nine flights, with the remaining four flights taking second place at the first ever HCAC Individual Flights Tournament hosted by the West Indy Racquet Club in Indianapolis.

Winners and conference champions for Manchester were Sarah Conwell at two singles, Jordin Youst at four singles, Jessica Mertz at five singles, Danielle Walker at six singles and the duo of Christa Hunter and Youst at two doubles. Mili Ridoutt placed second at one singles while she and Conwell took second at one doubles, and the team of Walker/Mertz took second at three doubles.

Manchester wrapped up the regular season on Monday with a 6-3 loss to Bethel. Winners for the Spartans were Christa Hunter and Jordin Youst at two doubles, Mili Ridoutt at one singles and Youst at four singles.

MEN AND WOMEN PLACE FOURTH AT MANCHESTER INVITE

Manchester College played host for the annual Manchester College Cross Country Invite on Saturday with both the men's and women's teams taking fourth place. In the women's race, Becca Flanders paced MC with a sixth place finish in 18:58, Jessica Bremer took 15th in 20:01, Megan Miller was 18th in 20:09, Breana Lindsay was 20th in 20:22 and Katherine Pea finished 25th in 20:38 to round out the top five place winners.

In the men's division, Andy Williams placed 12th overall with a 26:21 finish while teammate Josh Miller was two seconds behind in 26:23. Andy Hopkins took 22nd with a time of 27:02, Kyle Plethcer was 23rd in 27:09 and Kyle Cline took 30th in 27:26.

Manchester rests over the Oct. 20th weekend before gearing up for the HCAC Conference championships hosted by Hanover College on Saturday, October 27.

SPARTANS FALL TO HANOVER 30-28 AS PANTHERS HIT 44-YARD FIELD GOAL GAME WINNER

Hanover's Matt Herron connected on a 44-yard field goal as time expired to give Hanover a 30-28 victory over Manchester on Saturday. The Spartan offense was held to just 65 yards of offense in the first half, and used Beau Bradtmiller's 54-yard fumble recovery to help offset a 17-7 Hanover lead at the half. The Panthers opened up the third quarter with a touchdown reception, but Manchester's Brandon Wells scored on runs of four and 17 yards to pull the Spartans to within three, 24-21 with two minutes left in the third quarter. Herron hit a 26-yard field goal with 9:46 left in the fourth to go ahead 27-21.

The Panther defense made a goal line stance, holding off the Spartans' attempt to score on a first and goal from the Hanover one-yard line. The Spartan defense was able to force a Hanover punt and assembled a scoring drive as Chris Cecil scored on a three yard pass from Caleb Grimes to take a 28-27 lead with 22 seconds remaining.

A squib kick by Manchester gave the Panthers the ball at the 50-yard line with 18 seconds remaining, and were able to capitalize on pass completions of 16 and seven yards to set up for the 44-yard field goal.

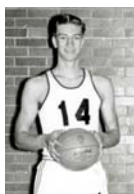
Quarterback Caleb Grimes ended the day 22-31 passing for 274 yards and a touchdown. Wells had 75 yards on 11 carries with a pair of touchdowns along with his four receptions for 27 yards. Jared Yoder had six catches for 90 yards.

Defensively, Bradtmiller had 11 solo tackles and the fumble recovery. Mike DePoy had eight solo and three assisted tackles. Jeff McDonald and Josh Kapla had seven tackles each.

Manchester falls to 3-3 overall, 1-2 in the HCAC. They return home Saturday as they host Mount St. Joseph on MC's Hall of Fame Day.
