ROSE-HULMAN EDGES MANCHESTER 31-28

Despite surrendering 200 more offensive yards to Rose-Hulman, Manchester fell by a three point margin on Saturday 31-28.

A Joel Hawkins interception pass set up a three-yard touchdown run by the Engineers to take a quick 7-0 lead in the first quarter. Manchester responded following a Mitch Harnish interception with a scoring drive capped off by a Brandon Wells one-yard run into the endzone. Less than 60 seconds later Manchester's Wes Atkins picked off a Rose-Hulman pass for a 53-yard touchdown score. A missed PAT attempt gave MC a 13-7 lead.

In the second quarter Rose responded with Bryan Wong's second TD of the day after a three yard run to give RHIT a 14-13 lead. MC bounced back with four minutes remaining in the quarter as Caleb Grimes found Jared Yoder on a nine yard touchdown pass. Grimes found Billy Cardwell for the two-point conversion to give MC a 21-14 lead, but the Engineers constructed a scoring drive with 19 seconds remaining to take a 21-21 tie into the half.

In the second half, Rose-Hulman scored on a 74 yard touchdown pass on the first play of their drive, then connected on a 30-yard field goal to go ahead 31-21 with 11 minutes remaining in the fourth. Michael Maciejewski scored for Manchester as Grimes found him on a seven yard touchdown pass with nine minutes left with Rose leading 31-28.

Wells had 55 yards rushing on 20 carries for MC. Grimes was 16-26 passing for 192 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Yoder ended the game with eight catches for 144 yards and a score.

Defensively, Atkins had seven solo tackles and the interception TD. John Sams, Jeff McDonald, Mike DePoy and Beau Bradtmiller recorded six tackles apiece for the defense.

Manchester falls to 3-6 on the year, 1-5 in the conference. They host Anderson on Saturday for the seventh annual Bronze Ball Trophy game starting at 1 p.m. hosted by Calvin College.

MANCHESTER FALLS TO TRANSYLVANIA IN THE HCAC TOURNAMENT FINALS 2-1

Manchester's men's soccer team winded down the season on Saturday with a 2-1 loss to Transylvania in the HCAC Conference Tournament Finals.

Transylvania broke the scoreless halftime score with a pair of goals at the 54th and 71st minute of action. Manchester's Brian Woods scored his 10th goal of the year, tying a season high total with Parker Swanson. Jake Johnson recorded four saves for MC.

They tied Rose-Hulman 0-0 after three overtime sessions on Tuesday in the semi-final game of the HCAC Conference Tournament. Manchester and Rose-Hulman were forced to a shootout following the second overtime session, with Manchester outscoring Rose 3-2.

Brian Huss, Chris Rowe and Tom Garrett each scored on the penalty kick shootout for MC, while Rose-Hulman's Trevor Miller and Brian Fulmer were able to slip their shots past MC goalkeeper Jake Johnson. Johnson recorded his fourth shutout of the season and had five saves in 110 minutes at the goalkeeper position.

The Spartans finish the season 12-6-2 overall, and tie a school record in wins set back in 1995.

MANCHESTER FALLS TO ROSE-HULMAN 4-2 IN HCAC SEMI-FINALS

Manchester's women's soccer team fell to Rose-Hulman 4-2 in the semi-final round of the HCAC Conference Tournament on Wednesday. Manchester trailed 3-0 until Kali Lauzon scored in the 73rd minute of play following a Paige Koomler assist. Rose picked up its fourth goal of the afternoon before Paige Koomler scored at the 88th minute on a Stephanie Phillips assist to make the 4-2 final. Manchester ends the year 7-10-3 overall.

Manchester College will recognize the leadership and coaching of Tom Jarman with a Sunday, Dec. 2 reception and dinner. Jarman retired in August as director of athletics, head wrestling coach and associate professor of exercise and sport sciences. He served the College 18 years, expanding its Division III athletics program, producing nationally recognized wrestlers and entering six halls of fame.

MANCHESTER WINS TOURNAMENT OPENER 3-1 OVER DEFIANCE

Manchester's volleyball team posted a 3-1 win over Defiance in the opening round of the HCAC Conference Tournament, hosted by Hanover. Manchester took game one 30-23, fell in game two 27-30, but rallied to win games three and four 30-22, 30-15 to advance to the semi-finals. Christa Peden led the Spartans with 16 kills. Stephanie Rion and Amy Carnahan each had 15 kills and 19 digs. Lauren Nash added 56 assists while Tiffany Moore added 22 digs.

The Spartans volleyball season came to a close in the semi-finals with a 3-0 loss to Mount St. Joseph. Game scores were 30-18, 30-21, 30-27. Carnahan led the team with 15 kills and 22 digs. Christa Peden added nine kills and five digs. Stephanie Rion also added nine kills with 15 digs and a solo block.

Manchester ends the season 16-15 overall under first year coach Kendra Marlowe, their first winning season since 1997.
