## MANCHESTER POSTS 40-7 WIN OVER EARLHAM IN HOME OPENER

The Manchester College football team picked up a 40-7 win over Earlham in the Spartans' season home opener on Saturday.

Manchester scored early in the second quarter as Chris Cecil scored on a 58-yard reception from Caleb Grimes to take a 7-0 lead. Earlham scored with nine minutes remaining in the half to tie the game at 7-7 before the Spartans engineered two scoring drives in the last five minutes of the half. Joel Hawkins scored in an 8 yard run while Brandon Wells worked his way into the endzone on a 1-yard run to give MC a 20-7 lead at the half.

Manchester scored twice in the third period as Jared Yoder connected on a 58-yard pass reception from Grimes and Brandon Wells scored his second TD of the game with 5:36 remaining on a 3-yard run for a 33-7 lead. Adam Schell scored from 10-yards out late in the fourth quarter to give the Spartans the 40-7 lead.

Wells ended the game with 105 yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns. Grimes was 11-18 passing for 229 yards and two TDs. Jared Yoder netted 150 yards receiving on seven catches to lead the Spartan offense.

Defensively, Mike DePoy had 10 tackles, while Dan Jones added nine. Zach Washington recorded eight tackles with a sack and Beau Bradtmiller tallied eight tackles.

Manchester improves to 1-1 on the year, and returns to action Saturday at Kalamazoo.

## ROWE SCORES GAME WINNER AS MC DEFEATS ALMA 1-0

Despite being down a player following a red card in Saturday's consolation match with Alma at the Ohio Northern Invite, Manchester was able to walk away with a 1-0 win over the Scots.

Chris Rowe scored unassisted in the 72nd minute of play to give Manchester the 1-0 lead. Goalkeeper Matt Mullen recorded 11 saves to aid in the win as Manchester was out-shot 22-6 in the game.

Manchester fell to Ohio Northern 4-0 in men's soccer action Friday in the opening game of the Ohio Northern Tournament. Goalkeeper Matt Mullen recorded 15 saves for MC in the loss.

Manchester moves to 2-4-2 on the year, and returns to action Tuesday at Goshen for a 7 p.m. start.

**SPARTANS WIN 2-1 OVER GOSHEN IN DOUBLE OVERTIME**

Manchester's women's soccer team needed double overtime on Saturday to defeat Goshen College 2-1. Kali Lauzon scored unassisted for Manchester in regulation to force overtime.

In the second extra session Paige Koomler scored on a Kendra Getz assist to give MC the win. Manchester moves to 3-2 on the year and returns to action Tuesday at home against Huntington.

**MANCHESTER'S WIN STREAK HALTS AT 39 WITH LOSSES TO TRANSYLVANIA AND FRANKLIN**

Manchester's women's tennis team fell to Transylvania 6-3 and Franklin 7-2 for their first conference losses in nearly six seasons.

Milli Ridoutt was a winner at one singles, as was April Erxleben at three singles and Brittany Oliver at four singles for the three flight wins for MC. Ridoutt and Oliver took wins at one and four singles respectively against Franklin.

The Spartans fall to 2-3 on the year, and return to action Saturday at Hanover with Defiance in a tri-way meet.

**MANCHESTER MOVES TO 8-1 FOLLOWING WIN OVER TAYLOR-FW**

Manchester's volleyball team used all five sets to defeat Taylor-Fort Wayne 3-2 on Tuesday. MC fell in the first set 19-25, rallied to win game two 25-14, then were edged out 25-23 in the third set. MC pulled out a 25-20 win in the fourth match and cruised to a win with a 15-6 win in the fifth set.

Christa Peden led the way with 17 kills. Stephanie Rion added 13 kills, six aces, three blocks and 27 digs. Tiffany Moore added 23 digs while Lauren Nash had 44 assists.

Manchester improves to 8-1 on the year, and returns to action next Wednesday at Anderson to start conference play.

**THE M ASSOCIATION WILL HONOR SCOTT MANNERING '79 AS ITS 2008 CLAUDE WOLFE COACH OF THE YEAR AT HOMECOMING ON OCT.11.**

Mannering has served 22 years as head coach of varsity football at Lewis Cass High School in Walton, Ind., where his Class 2A Kings finished 54-8 over the last five seasons, with two semi-state appearances. In 2006, the Indianapolis Colts recognized Mannering as its Colts/NFL Coach of the Week among Indiana high school football coaches.

Coach Mannering's 156-78 career has four sectional and three regional titles. At Lewis Cass, he also coaches junior high wrestling, varsity boys track and advises the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. His teaching roster includes weight training, junior high health and junior high physical education.

Before joining Lewis Cass, Mannering held assistant coaching positions at Knox and Marion high schools and as a graduate assistant for Ball State University, where he earned a master's degree in physical education. (He played Spartan football, while majoring in physical education.) He and wife Lisa Whitmyre '80 Mannering reside in Walton. They have three children, Clayton, Rory and Megan.
