# Manchester College

**M**anchester College, founded in 1889, is an independent, liberal arts and sciences college of the Church of the Brethren. In 2008, 1,145 students from 25 states and 25 countries studied here.

Manchester College traces its origins to the Roanoke (Ind.) Classical Seminary founded by the United Brethren Church in 1860. The Seminary became Manchester College in 1889, when the school was moved to North Manchester. In 1895, the Church of the Brethren purchased the campus and this affiliation continues today. Mount Morris College (Ill.) merged with Manchester College in 1932. The College welcomes students of all faiths and celebrates its relationship with the Church of the Brethren.

Manchester has been fully accredited since 1932 by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The Teacher Education Program is accredited by both the Indiana Professional Standards Board and the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education. The Social Work Program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. The Athletic Training program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE).

## Mission Statement

Manchester College respects the infinite worth of every individual and graduates persons of ability and conviction who draw upon their education and faith to lead principled, productive, and compassionate lives that improve the human condition.

## Values Statement

As a primarily undergraduate, residential, liberal arts community rooted in the tradition of the Church of the Brethren, Manchester College values:

## Academic Ceremonies and Regalia

The wearing of caps, gowns, and hoods at most colleges and universities today, including Manchester College, is rooted in a degree system (scholar, bachelor, master, and doctorate) that has evolved from 13th century European medieval universities.

The apparel tells a story. Gowns of masters and doctorates generally are ankle length and closed at the front. The master's gown has pointed sleeves slit at the elbows. The doctoral gown has wide lapels of velvet, full bell-shaped sleeves and three velvet chevrons on each sleeve. Once only black, the gowns now can be in the color of the school awarding the wearer's degree.

The hoods and skull caps are reminiscent of the unheated buildings of medieval times. They served a practical purpose: to warm the scholars' shaved heads. The hoods are now worn draped over the shoulders. The color of the lining of the hood indicates the university where the graduate degree was earned. The color of the border, satin for masters and velvet for doctors, identifies the field of study.

### Honors Cords and Graduation with Distinction

Students graduating with honors wear gold cords draped around the neck. To graduate with distinction, a candidate for the baccalaureate degree must have completed a minimum of 96 semester hours in residence at Manchester College and accumulated a grade point average (GPA) at or above 3.650. There are three levels of graduation with honors: summa cum laude (with highest honors) requires a grade point average of 3.950 to 4.000; magna cum laude (with high honors) requires a GPA of 3.850 to 3.949; and cum laude (with honors) requires a GPA of 3.65 to 3.849. The ceremony today recognizes students who met the requirements for graduation with honors at the end of the 2009 January Session. Final determination for graduation with honors will be made when all work is complete.

The Honors Diploma is awarded to seniors who have maintained a grade point average of at least 3.5, completed five semester hours of honors study each academic year, and successfully completed an honors thesis.

### Pledge of Social and Environmental Awareness

Students and faculty of Manchester who support The Graduation Pledge wear green ribbons on their gowns. This pledge is a commitment to make a difference in the world. Manchester College served as the headquarters of The Graduation Pledge Alliance from 1996 to 2007. Since its inception in the late 1980s, the Pledge has grown to more than 100 campuses in the United States and around the world. The Pledge is sponsored by the Peace Studies Institute and the Accounting and Business Club.

### HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS



**M**arsha Palmer '68 Link earned a bachelor's degree in music from Manchester College. She married her high school sweetheart, Bill Link, taught music for a time, and earned a master's degree in counseling from Purdue University in 1972.

The Links eventually settled in Irvine, Calif., and raised their family: a son, Bradley, and a daughter, Elizabeth. In addition to spending time with her two much-loved grandchildren, Marsha enjoys skiing and sustaining her passion for music.

A lifelong learner, Link completed the certificate program in human resources at the University of California Irvine, her master's degree in counseling and human resources from Purdue University in 1972, and her Ph.D. in clinical psychology from Fielding Graduate University in Santa Barbara, Calif., in 2005.

She has worked as a psychotherapist in hospitals and community counseling clinics, with a broad range of expertise in executive coaching, organizational development, and training. An experienced teacher in human resources management, Marsha has customized training programs in recruitment, conflict resolution, team-building, and strategic planning.

Marsha and Bill Link are the founders of Chiron Vision Corp., a leader in ophthalmic surgical products, and continue to be strong supporters of biomedical research. She also is principal and co-founder of Link Consulting Group, a management and organizational development firm specializing in health care. A dedicated volunteer, Marsha serves on many boards in her communities of Irvine, Calif. and Steamboat Springs, Colo.

Marsha Link maintains strong ties to Manchester College and believes firmly in giving back – in time, ability and resources. In addition to serving on the President's Leadership Council, Marsha recently started her third term on the Board of Trustees. Her earlier service was from 1998 to 2005.

Another of Marsha's contributions to the College can be found in Otho Winger Memorial Hall, where, as a music student, she spent many hours in study and practice. ## Degree Candidates Class of 2009

### HONORARY DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS



Dr. Timothy Johnson, has been one of the nation's leading communicators of health care information since his debut on ABC's *Good Morning America* more than 33 years ago. Through his television forum, he has offered insight into medical problems and policies, educating millions of Americans. He also provides on-air analysis of medical news for several other ABC news shows, *Nightline*, *20/20* and *World News*.

Dr. Johnson is on the faculty at both Harvard University and Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. He also is the founding editor of the *Harvard Medical School Health Letter* and is co-editor of the *Harvard Medical School Health Letter Book*.

Throughout his medical reporting career, he has shed light on numerous health issues and educated Americans on how to care for themselves better. He

co-edited the book *Your Good Health*, and, with former U.S. Surgeon General Dr. C. Everett Koop, co-authored the book *Let's Talk*. He also wrote *Dr. Timothy Johnson's On Call Guide to Men's Health*.

His written works are not limited to health and medicine. A seminary graduate and ordained minister in the Evangelical Covenant Church, Dr. Johnson explores his faith and shares his reflections on spiritual questions in his book *Finding God in the Questions*.

Winner of numerous awards for medical reporting, Dr. Johnson has been honored by the American College of Physicians, the American Heart Association, and the U.S. Surgeon General. He also is the winner of a National Emmy Award from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences, and two regional Emmys in New England.

He is a 1959 graduate of another excellent liberal arts school, Augustana College, in Rock Island, Ill. He studied theology at North Park Seminary in Chicago, graduating in 1963. Two years later, Dr. Johnson entered Albany Medical College, in Albany, N.Y., from which he graduated *summa cum laude* in 1969. He also holds a master's degree in public health from Harvard University.

Dr. Johnson has two children and one grandchild. He and his wife, Nancy Ann, live in the Boston suburbs. His mother, Eunice Danielson Johnson, graduated from Manchester College in 1928.
