highlights

In 2008, men's soccer finished second in the conference season, tied the school record for shutouts, and placed five players on the All-Conference team and two players on the Academic All-Conference team. Four-time All-Conference player Chris Rowe was named to the Great Lakes All-Region team. Ryan Deeter, Heriju Gadzama, and Tyler Yeager were named to the North/Central Scholar Athlete Team on which Manchester matched the total representation of the rest of the conference.

Under Head Coach David Good, the men's soccer team continues to excel. Coach Good's formula for success proves itself. He's been named Conference Coach of the Year five times. Good was an All-American midfielder as a college player, and his teams won one national championship and reached the NCAA Division III Final Four all four years of his college career.
