

## WOMEN'S GOLF

Play the sport you love and get the education you want. At Manchester, you'll play hard, study hard, and have opportunities to succeed at both. Even as a first-year student, you'll have the chance to compete at the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), Division III level. The black and gold Spartans also belong to the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), along with schools from Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky.

### opportunities

The men and women have the same coach but separate schedules. Basically, it's a two-season sport: the women play a fall season with additional meets in the spring to build strength and skill. The men's schedule is reverse with main competition in spring, a trip to Florida each year, and additional meets in the fall. Team work is important, and everyone's goal is to win the conference championship and gain a berth to the NCAA tournament.

### meet the coach

Fifth-year coach Jeff Kock, a 1998 MC graduate, has developed outstanding golf teams. Named HCAC Coach of the Year three times over the last four years, Coach Kock challenges his student-athletes to excel, both on the course and in the classroom.

### highlights

The women have placed seven individuals on the All-Conference team over the last four years; the men had three All-Conference selections in the last four years. The men have won one conference championship; the women tagged four in a row from 2003-07. The women also qualified for the NCAA National Tournament and finished 18th in the nation in 2006-07.

### facilities

Manchester College golfers practice and compete in most home events at Honeywell Golf Course located a few miles south of campus near Wabash. Golf team members also use the College's Physical Education and Recreation Center for weight workouts, athletic training facilities and meeting rooms.
