books, large mixed-media works, and primarily stitched-paper collage. For me, there is a natural ease in working with paper. As a child, my grandmother's seed catalogues offered hours of entertainment as I cut out single flowers to create elaborate bouquets. Working with paper feels like play.

I begin by sifting through my paper collection, snipping as I go. I intuitively arrange colors, textures, and images as I feel inspired. After I finish the composition, I glue, paint or stitch the pieces into place. Throughout this process, a set of symbols has instinctively appeared. At first, the symbols simply represented imagery I found aesthetically pleasing. Through practice though, I have come to realize that these symbols are much more. They represent how I spend my days, how I use my days, what is important to me, and how my life is being constructed.
