Study athletic training and earn two degrees in five years. You'll major in clinical and rehabilitation sciences and, after three years, take another two to earn your Master of Athletic Training. You'll get a headstart on your peers and save a year's worth of tuition. Some student-athletes choose to complete their degree in six years to maintain four years of athletic eligibility.

Pharmacy // Auburn, Ind.

"Everyone seemed very genuine and real."

"I went on a lot of college visits," says pharmacy major Nick Buttermore. But something special drew him back to Manchester. "Everyone seemed very genuine and real," says Nick, "and that was really awesome to experience."

The idea of starting pre-pharmacy here and getting an inside track to Manchester's Doctor of Pharmacy Program also drew him in. Community and relationships are important to Nick, so pharmacy was a good fit for him. "I wanted to be in something that would allow me to bring about change and help people" – which is exactly what he did when he participated in the Medical Practicum. In this three-week January course, students assist a team of medical professionals in remote villages of Guatemala, where quality health care is in short supply. For students majoring in the pre-health sciences, the experience can be life-changing. For Nick, the disparity between access to health care in these remote villages and the United States left a lasting impression. "I knew it would be a great learning experience, but it really became so much more," Nick says.

Now having completed his first year of pharmacy school on MU's Fort Wayne campus, Nick thinks he'll stay in the area. "You make great connections with people, and it's important to maintain them."



At Manchester's Medical Practicum during January session each year, students led by a team of medical professionals provide medical and dental care to remote Guatemalan communities. They get valuable hands-on experience that helps them discover their true passions and next steps.

Numi Tesfay speaks with a self-assured confidence. Maybe it's because the Manchester junior is from the metropolitan city of Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, where she attended a French school with international students and learned to speak four languages along the way.

Maybe, too, it's Manchester. A double major in business management and professional sales, Numi found career inspiration in Professor Joe Messer's Principles of Management course. After graduation, she plans to return home to help grow the family business. "You can build something based on what you love," says Numi. "I want to take my mom's company and make it a bigger thing."

Inside and outside of class, Numi discovered a supportive community at Manchester, which she calls her "home away from home." And here, just like back home in Ethiopia, her family and friends hail from around the globe. "At Manchester you have a whole new family that you can rely on," she says.

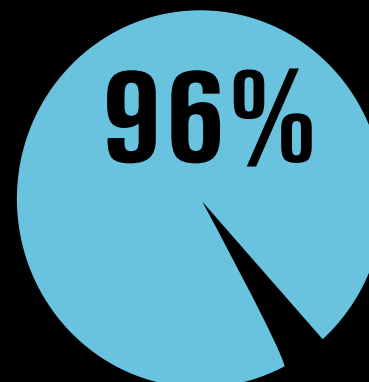

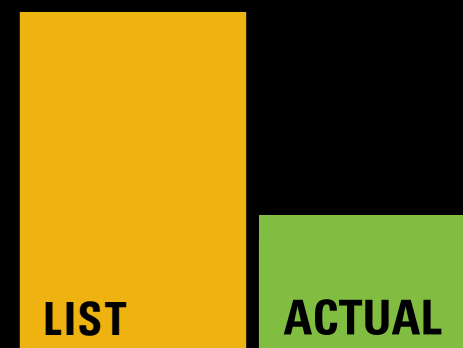
Academic Scholarships

Awards range from \$1,000 to \$20,000 based on academic information collected with application materials. These awards are for undergraduate study and are renewable up to four years.

Special Awards

Manchester offers additional awards for Church of the Brethren students and students who have a family member who attended Manchester. Scholarships for eSports and music are also offered.

You may be eligible for other aid, too, in the form of matching awards or individually assessed grants that respond to your financial needs.

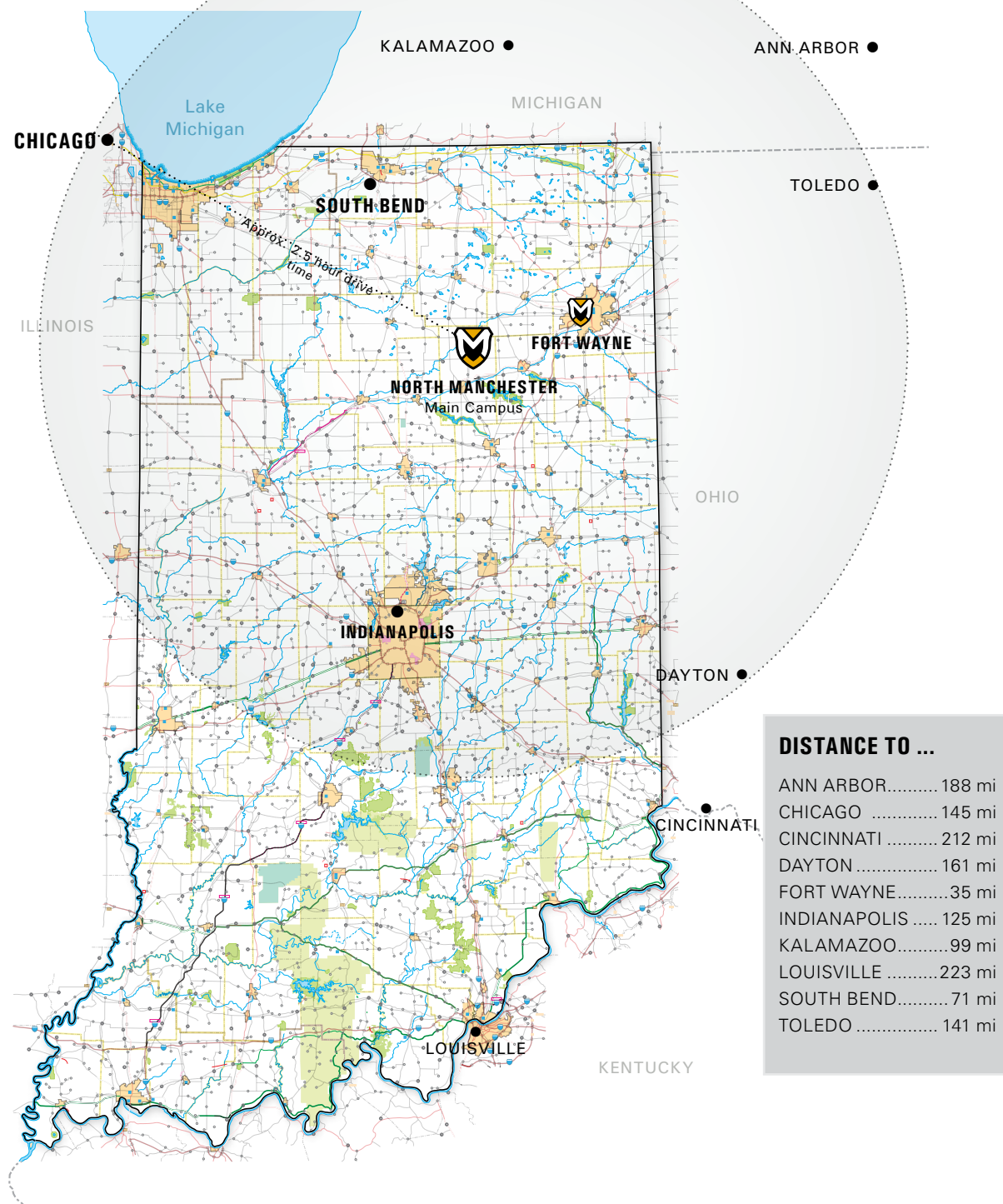

"I want to explore the world."

One reason Andy Vance chose Manchester was that she felt at home from day one. Through clubs and activities, she has made more friends than she can count, and the ones she made during Week of Welcome remain some of her best.

Another reason was MU's study abroad program. "I want to explore the world," says Andy, "and Manchester gives me that opportunity." In her first year, Andy traveled to London and Paris for a January session class, and she's already made travel plans for her next three years, which include an entire semester in London and trips to Belize and the Philippines for a class that isn't yet offered. But it will be if Andy has her say.

Andy's learned that if you want something, you make it happen – like her individualized major in performing arts administration. It wasn't listed in Manchester's Catalog, but that didn't stop her from switching from her original major and working with faculty and advisors to create her own customized career path.

"My first thought was, I'm going to have to transfer. But my advisor said, 'You don't need to do that,' and helped me create a whole new curriculum for what I wanted to study."
