INDUCTION OF THE PEACE POLE

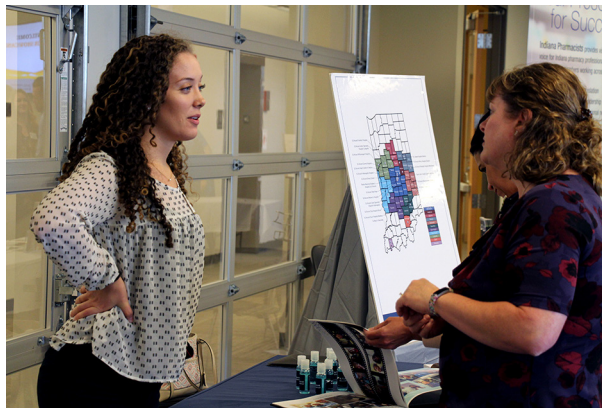
International Day of Peace (Thursday, Sept. 21) this year was celebrated at Manchester University Fort Wayne campus. This harmonious ceremony brought students and faculty together as a community to reflect on peacemaking in the world and the importance of peace at Manchester. The celebration included the installation of a brand new peace pole, positioned visibly in front of the building, welcoming all our students, faculty and guests.

Dr. Ahmed Abdelmageed, assistant dean of experiential education and community engagement, led an introduction about peace studies. The centrality of peace and peacebuilding on our campuses is essential to Manchester's mission. On the pole reads "May Peace Prevail On Earth" in four languages- English, Arabic, Spanish and Urdu.



PRECEPTOR SHOWCASE

Manchester University recently created an opportunity to invite a variety of preceptors from throughout the state of Indiana to our Fort Wayne campus. The preceptor showcase enabled pharmacy students to interact with future preceptors and sites with questions and concerns, and learn more about the experience. Seventeen booths that included faculty, retail/independent pharmacies, hospitals, and clinics for the under-served were featured in the showcase.



Immediately following, 29 preceptors attended a Continuing Education (CE) dinner. Dr. Renee McCafferty, associate professor of pharmacy practice at Manchester University and a pharmacist at Matthew25 (a free clinic for uninsured, low-income residents) spoke on “Pharmacist Patient Care Process: Putting Structure to Pharmaceutical Care.”



MANCHESTER LAUNCHES ONLINE PGx OPTION

Manchester University’s pharmacogenomics program is for aspiring students looking for a specialized field of health care. Manchester will launch an online program starting January in addition to the on-campus program. Both the on-campus and online students are awarded the same degree, Master of Science in Pharmacogenomics.

On campus, activities enable students to work in the lab with the most up-to-date equipment and training. Online students move through coursework at a slower

pace, but can complete their degree in as little as two years as opposed to the one-year on-campus program. In addition, online students can work in the comfort of their own home, without having to relocate to the Fort Wayne area. Application materials are to be submitted through the Pharmacy Graduate Application Service (PharmGRAD), which opens Sept. 20.
