

Senior Series

Call for Proposals – Due Friday, November 15

The VIA Committee is reviving a Manchester tradition known as *Senior Series*. Each semester one senior (or a group of seniors) will be selected to present a VIA program on a topic or theme of their choosing. Programs might take a variety of forms. For example, they may: reflect upon students' experiences and personal development at Manchester, focus on personal or societal values, address social or political concerns, or approach a topic from a scholarly perspective.

Goals:

- Showcase student creativity, insight and knowledge.
- Inspire other MU students to develop themselves by taking advantage of the many opportunities available at Manchester.
- Provide an engaging and meaningful VIA experience.

Proposal Process:

- Students who will be graduating seniors in spring or summer 2020 are invited to submit a proposal, due by November 15. The event will be planned, organized and executed by up to three seniors with the support and assistance of a faculty or staff mentor. Proposals must be submitted by the mentor with a letter of support. A proposal form is attached.
- The VIA Committee will select one proposal for a Senior Series program to be presented in spring, 2020.
- The committee will notify the selected person/group by December 20.

Criteria for Evaluation of Proposals:

- Program must focus on a clear and coherent theme or topic. Programs which are ill-defined, primarily entertainment, or consist of an unrelated collection of segments or performances will be evaluated less favorably.
- Program will be of interest to a broad cross-section of students.
- Program will be presented in an engaging manner using a variety of modes of expression (e.g., speech, music, film, artwork, photography, poetry, drama, readings).
- Student(s) proposing the event must be in academic good standing (CGPA \geq 2.0).
- Proposal must be supported by a faculty or staff member who will assist students in planning the program and arranging logistics.

Desirable Attributes:

- Program highlights student creativity and originality (including original works).

- Program is collaborative in nature involving members of the campus community in addition to the organizers.
- Program challenges students' assumptions about the topic being presented.
