

PLACEMENT EXAMINATION INFORMATION

All placement exams (except English) are completed online through ChetNet. Follow these instructions to access ChetNet:

MATHEMATICS

All students at Manchester University must complete a mathematics course as part of the Manchester Liberal Arts Curriculum (LARC) requirements. To ensure placement into an appropriate level, all new students are required to complete the mathematics placement examination. The results of this test will be used in conjunction with your high school records to determine the course that best meets your academic needs and background. Students who have completed AP courses or college-level courses through another institution should complete the exam to ensure proper placement.

CHEMISTRY

Students intending to study any of these areas – biology, chemistry, biology-chemistry, environmental studies, exercise science, athletic training, medical technology, pre-nursing or pre-pharmacy are required to take this placement exam. There are three parts of 20 questions each: 1) general mathematics; 2) general chemical information; 3) specific chemical knowledge.

SPANISH

Students who have taken Spanish in high school and are interested in taking Spanish courses in college must take the placement exam.

ENGLISH

Select students must submit an English writing sample. Students required to do this will be provided information by the Office of Admissions. The writing sample will be used in conjunction with your high school records to determine the course that best meets your academic needs and background.

MUSIC THEORY

Students interested in either a music major or music minor must take the Music Theory Placement Exam. The exam is for placement purposes only and will not affect admission to the Music Department or scholarship awards. This test is intended to help determine whether students will need to take the Music Fundamentals course during their first semester at Manchester.
