

2021 Summer Undergraduate Research Internships

May 24 - July 2

The Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences in the College of Pharmacy, Natural and Health Sciences is pleased to offer multiple, six-week summer undergraduate research internships to exceptional Manchester undergraduate students who will be entering their sophomore, junior or senior year after the 2020-2021 academic term. Preference will be given to students who have successfully completed courses in biochemistry, molecular biology, cell biology, and related courses.

During this internship, students will gain valuable hands-on experience while working alongside departmental faculty in multiple areas of pharmaceutical sciences, including medicinal chemistry, pharmacology, and pharmacogenomics. Current projects offer training in organic synthesis of new drug candidates, mammalian cell culture, genotyping, and other contemporary molecular biological and biochemical techniques. Students will be expected to work 20 hours per week and will be paid at the standard Manchester student employment rate. No student housing will be available in Fort Wayne.

Interested applicants should submit a letter of interest that describes career goals, current transcript (unofficial is acceptable), and a letter of support from a Manchester University science professor (emailed to Dr. Brown).
