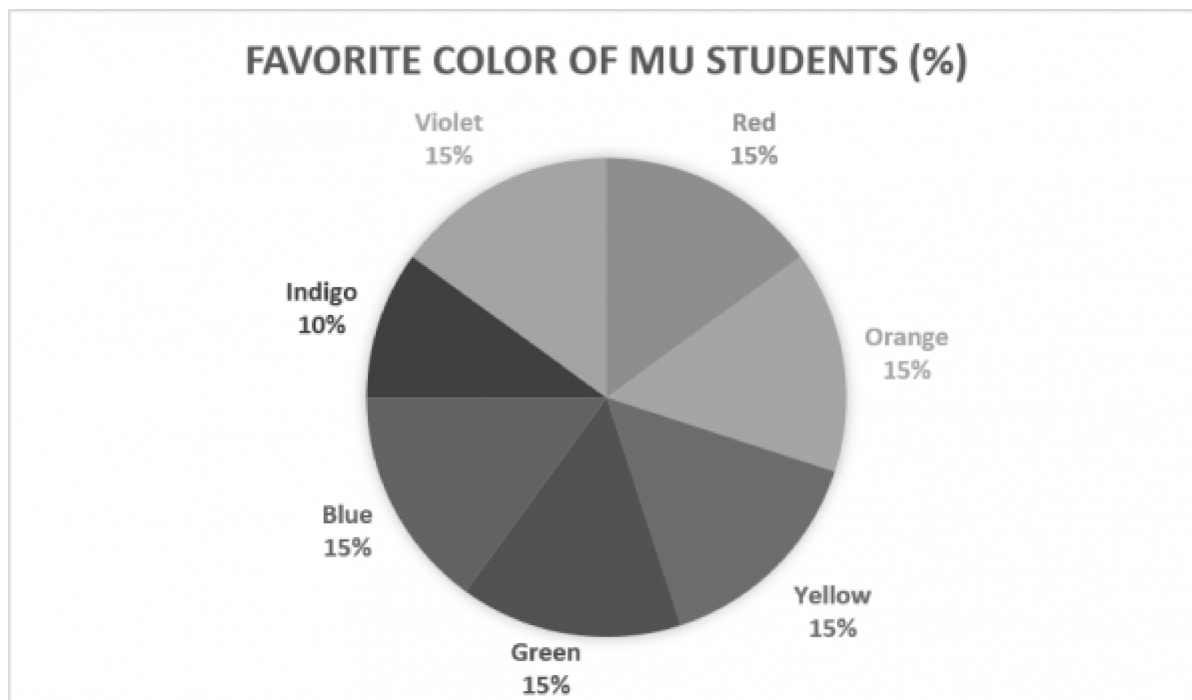


Introduction
