Now Accepting Community, Institutional IPPE Availability

If you are a community pharmacy preceptor within an hour's drive of Fort Wayne, IN, we want to sign you up to precept our 1st year IPPE students. You may precept up to four students, one for each of the time frames below:

- 80 hours from January 4th January 15th, 4 hours each Tuesday from February 2nd May 11th
- 80 hours from January 4th January 15th, 4 hours each Thursday from February 4th May 13th
- 80 hours from January 18th January 29th, 4 hours each Tuesday from February 2nd May 11th
- 80 hours from January 18th January 29th, 4 hours each Thursday from February 4th May 13th

Institutional Preceptors! If you host a hospital operations, institutional, or long-term care facility focused rotation, we want to sign you up to precept our 2nd year IPPE students. We are happy to send up to three students to you for each of the rotation blocks below:

- Four week experience from January 4th January 29th, completing 160 hours
- Four week experience from June 7th July 2nd, completing 160 hours

To submit your availability, simply login to CORE, click on the Scheduling tab on the left-hand side of the screen, and click Submit Availability. Select the 2021 IPPE I Community or 2021 IPPE II Institutional group from the drop down menu, and then add the students you are able to precept for each available block. Click Update Availability for Group when you are done and you are all set.
