### Manchester University

#### MISSION STATEMENT

Manchester University respects the infinite worth of every individual and graduates persons of ability and conviction who draw upon their education and faith to lead principled, productive, and compassionate lives that improve the human condition.

#### HISTORY

Manchester University, founded in 1889, is an independent university of the Church of the Brethren. In 2022-2023, 1,217 students from 25 states and six countries studied here.

Manchester University traces its origins to the Roanoke (Ind.) Classical Seminary founded by the United Brethren Church in 1860. The Seminary became Manchester College in 1889, when the school was moved to North Manchester. In 1895, members of the Church of the Brethren purchased the campus and this affiliation continues. Mount Morris College (III.) merged with Manchester College in 1932. Manchester welcomes students of all faiths and celebrates its relationship with the Church of the Brethren.

On July 1, 2012, Manchester College became Manchester University and, in fall 2012, students began studying at Manchester University Fort Wayne, home of the Pharmacy, Pharmacogenomics, Nursing, Physical Therapy and Athletic Training Programs.

Manchester has been fully accredited since 1932 by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The Teacher Education Program is accredited by the Indiana Professional Standards Board and the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education. The Social Work Program is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. The Athletic Training Program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education. The Doctor of Pharmacy Program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education. The Nursing Program has initial accreditation from the Indiana Board of Nursing and has the approval of the Higher Learning Commission.

#### VALUES STATEMENT

As a community of higher education rooted in the liberal arts and the traditions of the Church of the Brethren, Manchester University values:

- Learning, because high academic expectations in an environment combining liberal arts and professional preparation equip graduates to live healthy, productive and principled lives;
- Faith, because our diverse faiths call us to make the world a kinder and better place, establish justice, build peace amid strife, and model lives of *agape* (selfless love), *tikkun olam* (repairing a broken world), and *salam* (peace);
- Service, because committing self in service to others connects faith with action and abilities with convictions;

#### TRADITION

Each year, immediately following commencement ceremonies, our new graduates receive a small oak tree from the Alumni Association. An iconic symbol of the University, the oak represents the University's hope for our graduates – that they be strong, resilient and awe-inspiring, and that they rely on their deep roots to thrive.



### Academic Ceremonies and Regalia

Academic dress, inspired centuries ago in Europe, has evolved in the United States since colonial times. Today most colleges and universities, including Manchester, observe the academic dress code of the American Council on Education.

A scholar's highest degree determines the robe. Gowns for the master's and doctoral degrees are usually ankle length and, for bachelor's and master's degrees, untrimmed. A doctor's degree gown is more elaborate, with velvet facing and three velvet bars on full, bell-shaped sleeves.

Mortarboards are the standard headwear except for persons with doctorates who may chose a soft, rounded tam. Hoods, once worn on the head for warmth, are now draped over the shoulders and are longer for doctors than for masters.

Colors help tell the story. The color of the hood lining indicates the university where the graduate degree was earned. The color of the hood trim, satin for masters and velvet for doctorates, identifies the scholar's field. For those with doctorates, the velvet facing and bars of the gown may be black or the color of the academic discipline. Once only black, the gown itself can now be in the color of the university awarding the degree.

#### Pharmacy Graduation with Distinction

Students graduating with Latin honors wear gold cords draped around the neck. To graduate with distinction, a candidate for the Doctor of Pharmacy degree must have completed a minimum of 149 semester hours and accumulated a GPA at or above 3.50. There are three levels of graduation with honors: *summa cum laude* (with highest honors) requires a GPA of 3.90 to 4.00; *magna cum laude* (with high honors) requires a GPA of 3.70 to 3.89; and *cum laude* (with honors) requires a GPA of 3.50 to 3.69.

#### Undergraduate Graduation with Distinction

Students graduating with Latin honors wear gold cords. *Summa cum laude* (with highest honors) requires a grade point average of 3.950 to 4.000; *magna cum laude* (with high honors) requires a GPA of 3.850 to 3.949; and *cum laude* (with honors) requires a GPA of 3.650 to 3.849. At least 90 semester hours in residence at MU are required for a baccalaureate degree.

#### **Undergraduate Honors Recognition**

There are three levels of Honors recognition. Honors and Achievement requires a student to achieve a cumulative 3.5 GPA and complete at least 18 hours of honors coursework - 9 hours outside of the major, 6 hours in the major, and 3 hours of IDIV 495. Graduates wear an Honors Program graduate medallion engraved with the University crest. Honors requires a student to achieve a cumulative 3.5 GPA and complete a minimum of 12 hours of honors coursework - at least 6 at the 300-400 level. Graduates wear gold and black cords. Achievement requires a student to maintain a cumulative 3.5 GPA and 3 hours of IDIV 495. To qualify, students must apply no later than the beginning of senior year and have a strong recommendation from an instructor.

Alpha Mu Gamma - National Collegiate Foreign Language Honor Society. The cord colors are yellow.

Beta Beta - Biology Honors Society. The cord colors are blood red (zoology) and leaf green (botany).

Psi Chi - International Honors Society for Psychology. The medallion colors are dark blue and platinum.

Pi Gamma Mu – International Honor Society in Social Sciences (Indiana Theta Chapter). The cord colors are white and royal blue.

Pi Sigma Alpha - National Political Science Honor Society. The medallion color is red.

Sigma Tau Delta - International English Honor Society. The cord colors are rich cardinal red and black. The medallion colors are red, black and white.

Michael Packnett was president and CEO of Parkview Health from 2006 until his retirement at the end of 2022.

Committed to Parkview's mission and meeting the growing health care needs of northeast Indiana, he guided Parkview's growth from 50 providers and 6,300 co-workers to more than 1,000 providers

and 14,000 co-workers across 16 counties.

He also led the health system through challenging conditions, including the 2008 Great Recession and the COVID-19 pandemic.

During Packnett's tenure, Parkview expanded into Wabash, Kosciusko and DeKalb counties, opened Parkview Regional Medical Center and added specialized cancer care with the Parkview Packnett Family Cancer Institute.

Awarded the Sagamore of the Wabash in 2019, he played an integral role in regional development

initiatives, including transformational investments into the revitalization of downtown Fort Wayne with both Parkview Field and Electric Works. He is also a passionate advocate for advancement of the historically underserved southeast quadrant of Fort Wayne, supporting efforts to improve access to health care and early childhood education.

A member of the Manchester University Board of Trustees, Packnett has also served on boards of the Northeast Indiana Regional Partnership, the Regional Chamber of Northeast Indiana, the Indiana Chamber, the Allen County Capital Improvement Board and Greater Fort Wayne Inc.

He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Central Oklahoma and a master's degree in hospital administration from the University of Minnesota.

Before joining Parkview, Packnett served eight years as president and CEO at Mercy Health System of Oklahoma. He had been with the parent organization, Sisters of Mercy Health of St. Louis, Missouri, since 1993.



Glynn Hines is a 1973 Manchester graduate and longtime civic leader in Fort Wayne.

Elected in January 2023 as Fort Wayne City Council president, he has been on the council since 1999. He focuses on neighborhood empowerment, economic and business development, housing

revitalization, new-housing development, public safety initiatives and programs that give young people positive alternatives.

Hines was instrumental in placing a "Rosa Parks" seat on every Citilink bus in Fort Wayne.

He earned a bachelor's degree with a double major in history and in speech and drama from Manchester, and then went on to graduate study at Temple University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Hines is a recipient of the Manchester Alumni Honor Award, the highest recognition the Alumni Association can bestow on a graduate.

He has been a Xerox Corp. marketing manager and Bank One assistant vice president in the treasury management department. Through Brightpoint, he taught high school students core competencies related to work readiness, college preparation and life skills with Jobs for America's Graduates.

Hines chose to attend Manchester in 1968 after hearing about what was, at the time, a controversial decision to have Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. speak on campus. In February of 2021, he stood at the lectern where King spoke and gave the keynote address at Manchester's MLK Remembrance and Rededication Ceremony.

He told students about campus tensions in his day that led to physical altercations. One led to Black students seeking sanctuary in Petersime Chapel. This pivotal moment led to his role in establishing the AAFRO House – Afro Americans Forming Rightful Objectives – more than 50 years ago.
