The Master of Athletic Training degree prepares students to become Certified Athletic Trainers (ATC). Athletic trainers find careers with professional sports teams, colleges and universities, high schools, hospital-based clinics and industry.

An entry-level master's is for students with minimal knowledge and experience in athletic training and who have earned a bachelor's degree in a different discipline. A Master of Athletic Training degree in addition to a baccalaureate degree in another area enhances your versatility in the job market, and enriches the overall breadth of the profession.

Admissions requirements
