Athletic training to study abroad

For the first time, the Manchester University Athletic Training program will offer a course abroad. Students in the International Sports Medicine course will travel to Ireland and London during January session 2015. Offered every other year, the course will consist of visits to the University of Dublin, Croke Park, Wimbledon, local castles and site seeing. Students will be immersed into local culture and history while learning more about local health care and global perspectives on sports medicine and physiotherapy.
